### **Tips for entering produce in Show**

- **Presentation plays a big part in competition**
- Wipe exhibits clean. A polish with a soft cloth helps improve appearance of melons pumpkins etc
- Try to pick exhibits without any skin blemishes
- Where an entry requires more than one piece of fruit/vegetable keep all pieces to a similar size and shape. It is better to have two smaller even sized and coloured specimens than two uneven large ones.
- Shallot roots can be trimmed neatly to improve appearance. Rhubarb leaves maybe trimmed if wished. Both can be tied together with string or rubber band to help stand neatly in their bottles of water.
- Sweet corn should have the husk left on for judging.
- Pumpkins/squash look best with a trimmed short stork/stem of approx. 3-5 cms.
- Stewards are happy to answer any of your questions prior to the show.
