# ADDITIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUD CATTLE

- All animals MUST be the bone fide property of the exhibitor and MUST be identified with either a brand or a tattoo.
- 2 Dehorned cattle may compete if it is acceptable to the respective breed Society.
- 3 Broad ribbon winners MUST participate in the Grand Parade.
- 4 Stud cattle may leave the Showground after 4 p.m. Judging Day.
- 5 All stud cattle will be weighed before judging if scales are available.

# HEALTH REGULATIONS FOR BOTH STUD AND PRIME CATTLE

- 1 Stock MUST originate from herds free from Brucellosis, Tuberculosis and Trichomoniasis
- 2 Stock MUST be sprayed for ticks if they are from a tick area. Millmerran is in a tick free area.
- Any animals coming across a state border must be accompanied by health papers signed by a Government Veterinarian in relation to their Johnes Disease status. Millmerran is in a Johnes protected area.

# 3 (a) BEEF YOUNG JUDGES' COMPETITION

#### YOUNG JUDGES RULES

1. **The Hormel slide** must be used at all levels in the Young Judging Competitions. To be eligible for the State Finals, competitors must comply with all of these Rules.

#### **Local Show Rules**

- 2. Competitors must be aged 15 and under 25 years on 1st of May in the year of the State Final.
- 3. Competitors under 18 years of age must have parent or guardian approval to compete in any of these competitions..
- 4. Competitors are to be a resident in Queensland for at least three (3) months prior to competing or attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under Rule (5) below.
- 5. Competitors residing over the border who can prove an affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry provided they satisfy one (1) of the following criteria-
  - Their address has a Queensland postcode;
  - b. They have a Queensland phone number; or
  - c. The competitor or their parents are active working members of that Show.
- 6. National winners or persons on a National judging panel for that event are ineligible to compete.
- 7. It is considered good ethics that a Junior or Associate Judge, judging in his/her own right at a show should not consider themselves eligible to enter the Young Judges competition at the same show. However they would remain eligible to enter at shows where they are not acting in a judging role.
- 8. Entry forms must be completed by all competitors before the commencement of judging at local show level. On completion of Judging the Winner and Runner Up forms should be correctly annotated and forwarded to the show hosting the Sub-Chamber final and a copy sent to the coordinator.

#### Sub-Chamber Rules.

- 9. Rules (1-8) above apply to all Sub-Chamber Finals.
- 10. Sub-Chamber Coordinators will decide the number of Competitors from each eligible Show who will compete at Sub-Chamber Final.
- 11. Competitors can represent only one (1) Show in the Sub-Chamber Final.
- 12. Entry Form should be completed prior to Show Society judging as noted in Rule eight (8) above. Coordinators/Stewards must ensure a completed Entry Form is held for each finalist prior to the commencement of Sub-Chamber Judging. On completion of Judging the Winner and Runner Up forms should be correctly annotated and forwarded to the QCAS Office as early as possible.

Competitors in Class 1 must be under 15 years of age on 1 May and Competitors in Class 2 must be under 25 years of age on 1 May, in the year of the State Final.

Darling Downs Young Judges Competition, to be held at Pittsworth on 14 May 2021

The winner, of the Beef Young Judges Competition, attaining the highest points from Classes 1 and 2, will have their name inscribed on the Don Anderson Memorial Shield.

# 3 (b) PARADERS COMPETITION

### **PARADERS' COMPETITION RULES**

To be eligible for the Sub Chamber and State Finals, Competitors must comply with ALL Rules noted below. Show Society and Sub Chamber Coordinators are to ensure relevant rules are enforced for competitions under their control.

Paraders' competitions are designed to determine the Parader who presents an animal before a judge most effectively.

- 1. Paraders will parade their animals in a clockwise manner as is normal in a Cattle Judging Ring at the discretion of the Judge.
- 2. Competitors must be over 15 and under 25 years of age on 1 May in the year of the State Final.
- 3. Competitors under 18 years of age must have the approval of a parent or guardian to compete.
- 4. Competitors are to be resident in Queensland for at least three (3) months prior to competing or be attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under rule six(6) below
- 5. Competitors residing interstate who can prove an affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry provided they satisfy one (1) of the following criteria:
  - a. Their address has a Queensland postcode;
  - b. They have a Queensland phone number;
  - c. The competitor or their parents are active working members of that show.
- 6. National winners are ineligible to compete.

Note: Affiliated Shows may decide to run other age groups, this is permissible, BUT all Sub Chamber Finals are to be run as per the State Final RULES. All entry forms are to be completed correctly.

## Procedures and guidelines for local show level competition

- 7. Different age classes may be added to programs at local Show level.
- 8. Beef Cattle Paraders may lead a Steer, Heifer or Bull under 20 months.
- 9. Dairy Cattle Paraders may lead a DRY Dairy Female under 36 months.
- 10. Paraders must wear a white dust coat and not display any name or logo at the Stewards discretion.
- 11. For safety reasons, Judges are not permitted to ask Competitors in Young Parader Competitions to swap animals.
- 12. No glitter is permissible on animals or paraders. Cattle are to be presented in their natural, clean state.

#### **Entry Forms**

- 13. An entry form must be completed by all competitors.
- 14. Entry Forms for Local Show Winner and Runner Up must be forwarded to the Show hosting the Sub Chamber final and a copy sent to the Sub Chamber Coordinator/Secretary.
- 15. Separate Entry Forms must be completed for each competition being entered.

## Procedures and guidelines for Sub Chamber and State level competition.

- 16. One class of Paraders is to be judged.
- 17. Beef Cattle Paraders may lead a Steer, Heifer or Bull under 20 months.
- 18. Dairy Cattle Paraders may lead a DRY Dairy Female under 36 months.
- 19. Paraders must wear a white dust coat and not display any name or logo.
- 20. Paraders must be willing to swap animals, if required. This is not recommended at Sub Chamber level but Competitors at this level must be aware that swapping of animals may occur at State and National levels of this competition. If it is deemed necessary to swap animals, prior to the commencement of judging, Stewards are to consult with the Owners of beasts to ascertain if their animals can be switched between handlers. Stewards are to advise Judges that switching animals is only to be considered if agreed by owners and where absolutely necessary to achieve a result.
- 21. Animals are to be presented in a clean natural state, no glitter etc. allowed.

Competitors in Class 3 must be under 8 years of age on 1 May, Competitors in Class 4 must be under 15 years of age on 1 May and Competitors in Class 5 must be under 25 years of age on 1 May, in the year of the State Final.
